- Visitors are not permitted during the Retreat.
- If the camper must leave early:
 - Turn in a note during registration time.
 - Talk with Eric or Lynn when you come to pick up the camper.
 - You must sign out at the office.

Things NOT to Bring...

- Snacks Unless needed for a medical condition. Please notify camp before arrival if this is the case.

- Alcohol, tobacco, drugs, etc.
- Pocket knives
